SUPPLEMENTAL ADVISORY

REVISED GUIDELINES AS PER IATF-MEID RESOLUTION NO. 85 SERIES OF 2020

Pursuant to Inter-Agency Task Force for the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases (IATF-MEID) Resolution No. 85 Series of 2020 dated 26 November 2020, the following revised guidelines are hereby implemented, to wit:

- 1. Starting December 7, 2020, the following may be allowed entry privileges to the Philippines under Republic Act No. 6768 or the "Act Instituting the Balikbayan Program"
 - a. Filipino citizens' foreign spouses and children, regardless of age, who are **travelling with** them;
 - b. Former Filipino citizens, including their spouses and children, regardless of age, who are **travelling with** them.
 - 1.1. The Filipino or former Filipino should be **TRAVELLING TOGETHER** with the spouse or children, otherwise shall be **EXCLUDED/DENIED ENTRY**, if are not qualified in the other exemptions from entry travel restrictions **[Annex A]**. Grandchildren, grandparents and in-laws are not eligible under the Balikbayan privilege.
 - 1.2. Airline staff may require either of the following documentary requirements from Balikbayan passengers under non-visa required countries pursuant to Executive Order No. 408, s. 1960, prior to boarding the same:

a. Foreign Spouses

- Copy of Marriage Certificate
- Previous immigration arrival stamp with Balikbayan (BB/RA6768) status

b. Dependents/Children

- Copy of Birth Certificate, indicating that either or both parents are Filipino nationals;
- Copy of previously issued or expired Philippine Passport;
- Previous immigration arrival stamps with Balikbayan (BB/RA6768) status:
- Original or certified true copy of Decree of Adoption (for legally adoptive children)

c. Former Filipino

- Copy of previously issued or expired Philippine Passport;
- Copy of Birth Certificate;
- Previous immigration arrival stamps with Balikbayan (BB/RA6768) status.

- 2. They shall be admitted under RA 6768 with one year validity of stay from the date of arrival.
- 3. The entry of these persons shall be subject to the following conditions:
 - **a)** Those nationals from visa-free countries under Executive Order No. **408**, series of 1960 as enumerated in Section H of Department of Foreign Affairs (DFA) Foreign Service Circular (FSC) No. 157-2016 dated 02 September 2016 [Annex B].

Family members of Balikbayans who are nationals of countries as well as former Filipino citizens who acquired citizenship and passports of countries not included in Section H are **NOT ENTITLED** to the Balikbayan privilege. They must secure **ENTRY VISAS PRIOR TO THEIR TRAVEL TO THE PHILIPPINES.**

- b) With pre-booked quarantine facility;
- c) With pre-booked COVID-19 testing at a laboratory operating at the airport; and
- d) Subject to the maximum capacity of inbound passengers at the port and date of entry.

Starting 07 December 2020, the following shall be allowed entry under *Balikbayan* Privilege (RA6768) (only nationals from **non-visa required countries** under *EO408*):

17. **Filipino citizens' foreign spouses and children**, regardless of age, who are **travelling with** them**_***;

1. Overseas Filipino Workers (OFWs)

Documentary requirements:

- a. Valid work visa and contract;
- b. Overseas Employment Certificate (OEC);

DEPARTURE

- c. Pre-Departure Orientation Seminar (PDOS) certificate;
- d. Seafarer's Identification and Record Book (for seaman);
- e. Departure Card

2. Students enrolled abroad and participants accepted in exchange visitor programs

Documentary requirements:

- a. Valid visa;
- b. Commission on Filipino Overseas (CFO) Certificate (for first time travellers)
- c. Departure Card

3. Permanent residents of foreign jurisdictions and foreign nationals

Documentary requirements:

- a. Valid Permanent Visa or Permanent Resident Card:
- b. Commission on Filipino Overseas (CFO) for first time immigrants
- c. Departure Card

Outbound travel of Filipinos shall comply with the following requirements:

- a. For those travelling on tourist or short-term/visitor visas, submission of confirmed round-trip tickets and adequate travel and health insurance to cover travel disruptions and hospitalization in case of COVID-19 infections during their allowable period of stay abroad;
- Execution of a **Bureau of Immigration Declaration** acknowledging the risks involved in travelling, including risk of delay in their return trip, to be provided at the checkin counters by the airlines;
- c. Whenever required by the country of destination or the airline, a negative COVID-19 test taken in accordance with the health and safety protocols of such destination country or airlines; and
- d. Upon return, they shall **follow the Guidelines** of the National Task Force (NTF)
 for **Returning Overseas Filipinos.**

18. Former Filipino citizens, together with their foreign spouses and children, regardless of age, who are travelling with them

Kindly take note that inbound balikbayans are also required to comply with the **IATF and immigration conditions b-e.**
